Call for Papers

Each submitted abstract/paper will go through a rigorous peer review by domain experts, during which it will be evaluated based on the following criteria: originality, depth of technical and/or research knowledge, accuracy and relevance to the conference's themes and applicability of the real-world contexts.

Authors whose abstracts are selected will have the opportunity to present their full paper in the conference.

Guidelines for Paper Submission

For Abstract

- ✓ Abstracts must be structured and concise, containing 200 to 250 words
- ✓ The structure should cover research objectives, methodology and major findings
- ✓ Formatting should adhere to A4 size, Times New Roman with font size 12 and 1.5 line spacing

For Research Paper

- ✓ Papers must be original and unpublished, reflecting the conference theme
- ✓ The size of the paper should be between 6,000 to 8000 words, including figures, tables and references
- ✓ The paper should follow the suggested structure: Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Review of Literature, Methodology, Research Findings, Conclusion and References
- ✓ Authors Details should include Full Name, Designation, Affiliation, Phone number and email Id on the first page of the manuscript only
- ✓ Tables and charts should have self-explanatory titles and be numbered as referred to in the text. The sources, wherever necessary, should be mentioned at the bottom of the tables/charts/graphs
- ✓ Formatting requirements: A4 size, Times New Roman font size 12 and 1.5 line spacing.
- ✓ References should be cited using APA (7th edition) style
