India and UK to strengthen education collaboration

December 16, 2020

India and the United Kingdom have expressed the resolve to further strengthen their educational collaboration. In a bilateral meeting between Education Minister Shri Ramesh Pokhriyal 'Nishank' and Foreign Secretary of UK Rt. Hon. Dominic Raab, the two countries agreed to deepen their engagement in the field of education and research, and work collaboratively on mutual recognition of academic qualifications over the next year.

Rt Hon. Dominic Raab hailed India's National Education Policy 2020 as visionary, and said the proposed reforms will open up opportunities for students, the economy and for deeper engagement and collaboration between the two countries. A joint Task Force will be set up for Mutual Recognition of Academic Qualifications. Education Minister says this will support India's efforts for internationalization of education.

UGC to offer 78 UG, 46 PG courses through SWAYAM platform in January 2021

December 28, 2020

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has decided to offer over 100 online courses in January 2021 through the SWAYAM platform. Out of these courses, 78 will be undergraduate programmes and 46 will be postgraduate programmes.

- UGC is offering 78 UG courses and 46 PG courses on SWAYAM platform.
- The courses offered by UGC on SWAYAM will be free of cost.
- The tentative dates for the course examinations are May 8 and 9, 2021.

The Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) will be made available for students by the University Grants Commission from the January semester in 2021 on the SWAYAM platform, which has been set up by the central government.

Vidyagama is back in Karnataka

Vidyagama, the continuous learning programme for school children will be re-launched with lessons being held on campuses.

Primary and Secondary Education Minister S Suresh Kumar said students will be divided into smaller groups of 15 to 20 considering the number of teachers and classrooms available in each school

Discussions also happening to implement 'Vidyagama' programme in private schools too. The state government has also released detailed time table to start the programme. Classes are expected to start in the first week of January ending the uncertainty of learning for 54 lakh government school children and several lakhs of low-income group children studying in low-budget schools.

Task force recommends review of Nali Kali Curriculum

December 21, 2020

The task force which was constituted to roll out the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in Karnataka has recommended that the activity-based teaching-learning method adopted under the Nali Kali curriculum be reviewed and revised. The task force also has said that grade three should be separated from grades one and two.

The Nali-Kali teaching-learning method was rolled out in 1995 as a small UNICEF-assisted pilot project in H.D. Kote, Mysuru. It also helped cater to schools where there were shortages of teachers as classes one to three are clubbed together.

Rural private schools in Karnataka to stop e-classes as government fail to meet their demands

December 21, 2020

Private schools, especially in rural Karnataka, will suspend online classes with the State government failing to meet their demands. The schools, under the aegis of Recognised Unaided Private Schools Association (RUPSA) had sought a Rs 1,000-crore relief package from the government, to pay salaries of five lakh teachers. School managements say they are under loss due to the government's decision on fee payment, and have demanded that a minimum fee structure be fixed.

A turn for good with tweaked rules at Kalyana Karnataka region's schools

The government's move to amend the cadre and recruitment (C&R) rules to allow engineering graduates to teach science and mathematics from the sixth standard to eight standards has come as a blessing in disguise for six districts in the Kalyana Karnataka region. According to sources in the Commissionerate of Public Instruction, Kalaburagi, the department had conducted Teachers' Eligibility Test (TET) coaching for about 5,000 candidates last year in association with Kalyana Karnataka Region Development Board. Nonetheless, a disappointing number of candidates got qualified in the centralised mock test conducted by the department in the region.

Karnataka to set up more medical colleges under PPP model: K Sudhakar

Karnataka needs more medical colleges to meet the demand for doctors and the government was willing to establish them under the Public-Private Partnership (PPP), said Health and Medical Education Minister Dr K Sudhakar. “Establishing a medical college requires Rs 600 crore to Rs 700 crore. If it is built under the PPP model, it reduces the burden on the state exchequer and helps to provide affordable medical education and treatment to the needy.
