



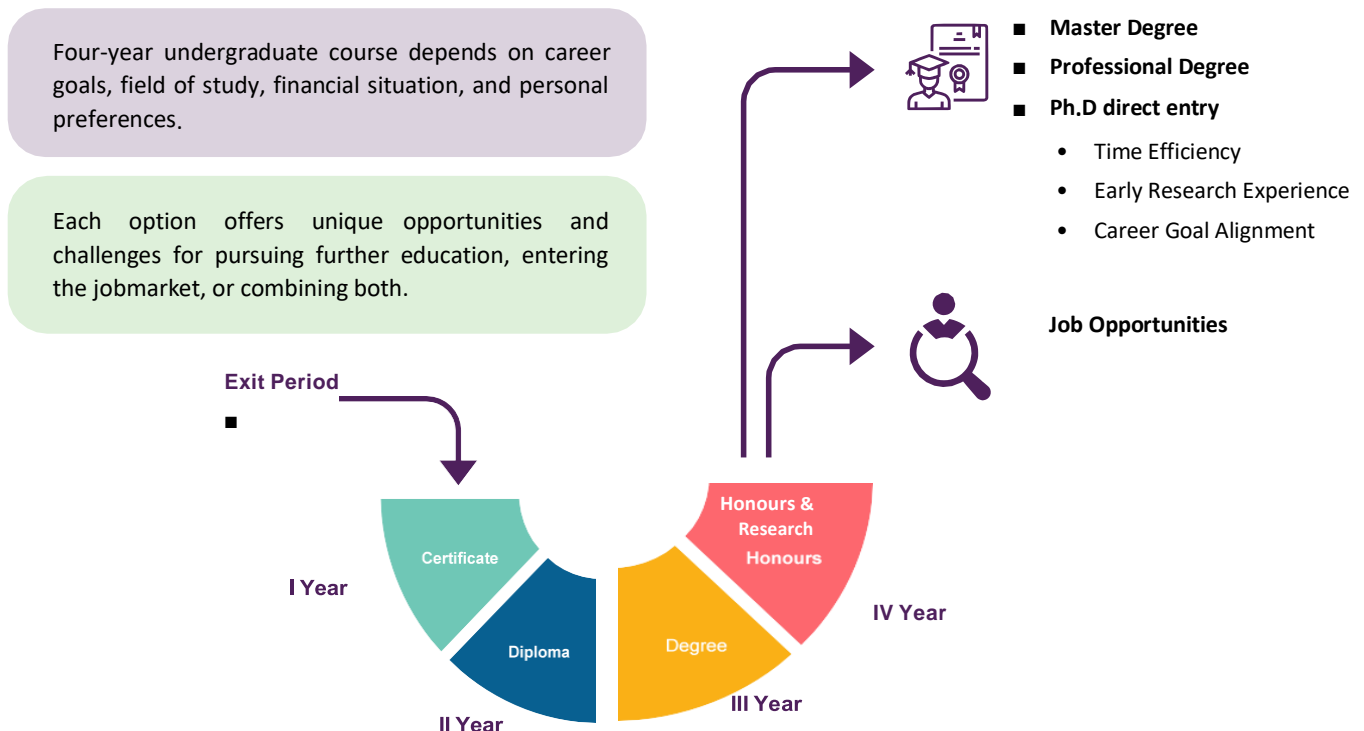

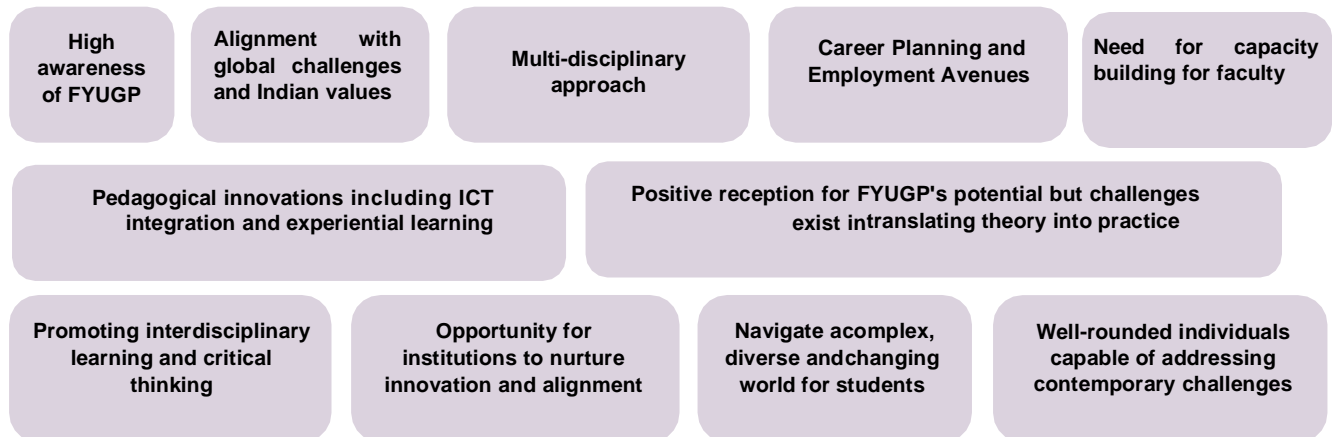

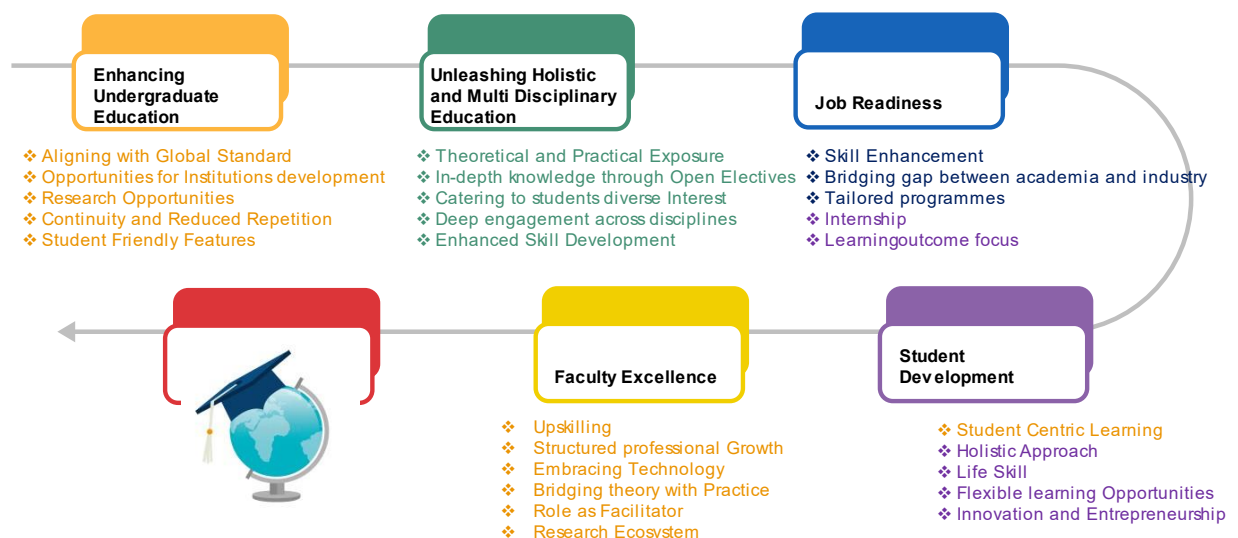


Perspectives on Four-Year Undergraduate Program: Research Insights

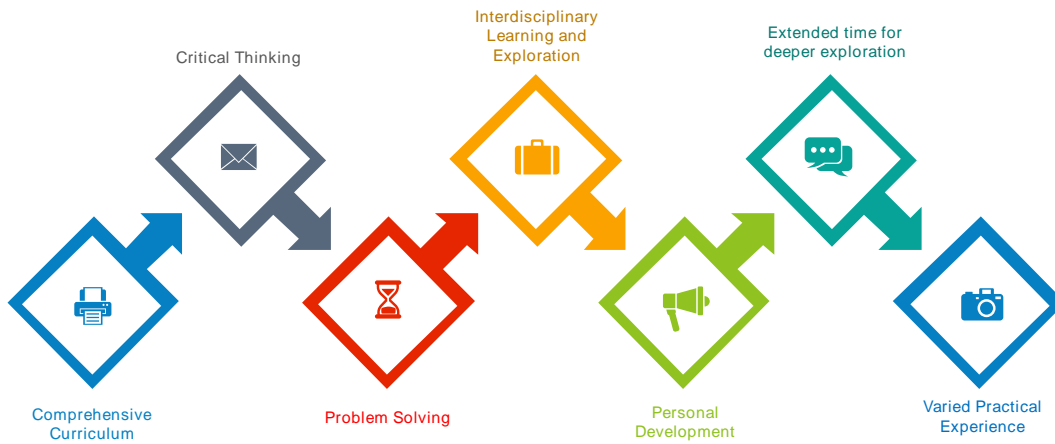

The stakeholders' feedback was gathered, yielding the following inputs for futuristic action.

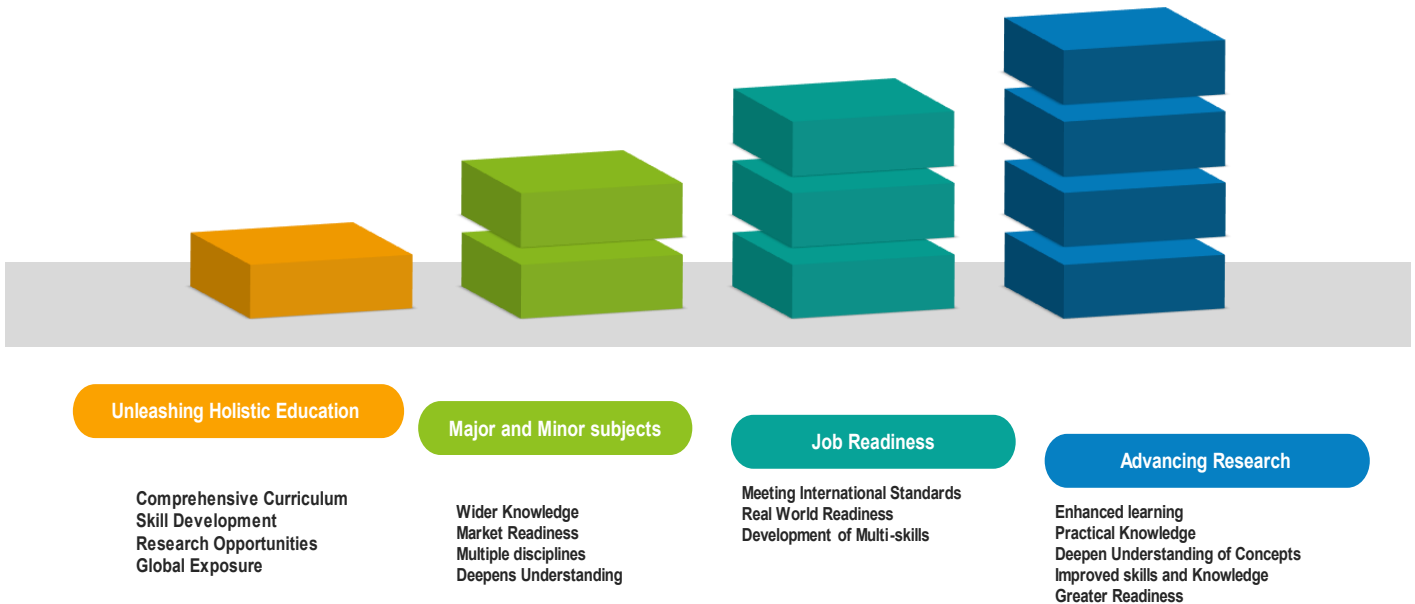

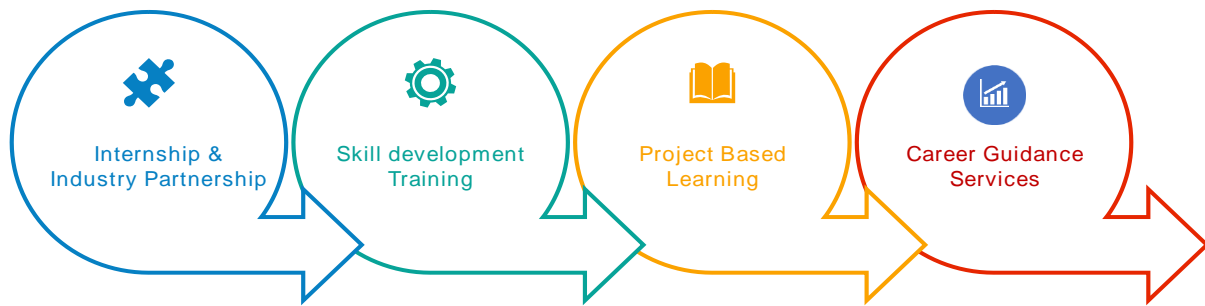

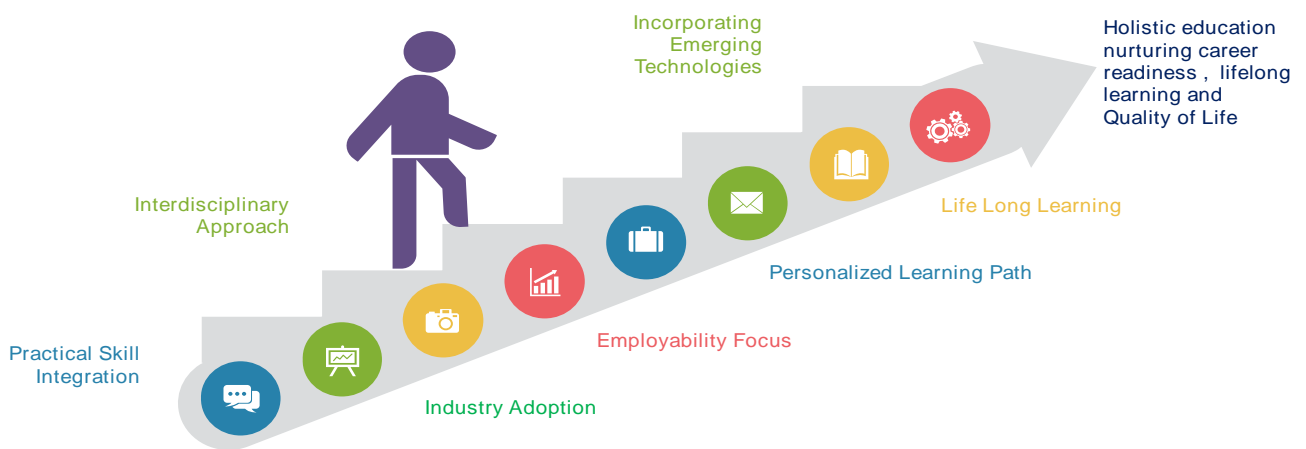


Strategies for Enhancing Employability
